

## Adult .22 Report Feb. 26, 2011

In between shooting the talk was about .22 ammunition and the frustration of one lot shooting well and the next lot is a dog. Jeff Madison had a set of calipers with him and we started measuring the diameters of the various brands of ammo we had on hand. Some bullets had a diameter of .222 others were .223 and .224. I had some .224 diameter Aguila Target Rifle ammunition that shot great in my Anschutz rifle and then I opened up a new brick of Aguila Target Rifle ammunition and it could barely hold the 9 ring out of my Anschutz rifle. The new brick of Aguila had bullets of .222" diameter. I could feel the difference when I chambered the cartridge. Jim Devereaux had the same problem with the Aguila ammo. However the .222" diameter bullet Aguila ammunition shot pretty well in my Brno #1 hunting rifle shooting mostly 10's and X's with just a couple of 9's. All the shooting was done on the A-36 target.

I also brought in a Romania Army .22 training rifle on which I had mounted a one power Canadian Rocket launcher scope. Rod Exo played with that rifle and got the scope some what zeroed at 50 feet. That rifle was real picky about ammunition. It liked wolf Match and CCI High Velocity. The Aguila .222 diameter ammo was a slight key hole at 50 feet.

We did so much talking and gun gawking that we only shot the Target Rifle fifty cent match and ran out of time to shoot the Squirrel rifle match.

I won the Target rifle match and Jeff Madison came in second, seems he ran out of his good ammo and let one 9 slip out. I won by Creedmoor my last shot was an X and Jeff's was a 10. So I took home the princely sum to two dollars and the usual losing lottery ticket. Jeff's second place lottery ticket was a loser too. Could the lottery be a chump game!

Next Saturday if the weather is half way decent, I will be shooting a midrange match in Midland, if I am not at Cadillac Chuck Wagner will run the Cadillac .22 shoot.
