<u>January</u>

Memberships were coming in steady with a total of 187 renewed so far. Highpower Match dates were set. CPL had a class scheduled for 13 students. Jr. 22 was off to a great start with an average of 15 youth shooters per week. MUCC report included the incredulous Ann Arbor whitetail deer sterilization plan.

February
